John Chapter 4



"Come and see a man who has told me everything I have done! Could this man be the Christ?" Many Samaritans in that city believed in Jesus because of the woman's words when she testified, "He told me everything I have ever done." John 4:29; 39 When you tell your story, it's God who is responsible for changing people's hearts. We are simply called to be ready and then to share what God has done in our lives. We have the power to share our story of faith. Scripture reminds us of that power. God's Spirit lives inside you from the moment you first trust Christ as Lord and Savior. The Holy Spirit gives you the power to be His witness (Acts 1:8). We do not even have to muster up courage or even be an amazing speaker (1 Corinthians 2:1-5). Just be honest about who Christ is and what He's done in your life.

God is already working in the lives of others. You cannot tell whether someone is moving toward or away from Him based on simple outward appearances (Acts 17: 26-27). Do not let assumptions keep you from asking others about their spiritual journey and sharing your story of how God has met you. God invites us to be a part of other people's spiritual journey to faith (2) Corinthians 5:20). Your story might help connect someone to Jesus. We just have to be ready. We should always be ready to give a reason for the hope that we have in Christ (1 Peter 3:15). One great way to be prepared is to write out your spiritual story (your faith testimony) ahead of time. After you have written out your story, practice it out loud a few times. Try recording yourself. Time it out, aiming for five minutes or less. Make sure what you've said is clear.

Ask God to bring someone to your mind—a friend, a family member, or an acquaintance-who doesn't have a relationship with God yet. Then pray for God to draw that person to Himself. Ask God to help you see and take the opportunities He provides to share your story. He might give you that chance in the midst of everyday conversations, or you could set up a time to talk. Before you begin to share your story, ask permission. You might say, "Can I tell you a little about my spiritual experience."

Sharing your story is not meant to be a one-way conversation. It is a chance to show you care by listening and taking an interest in the other person's story. Ask questions to clarify what you have heard such as: "What have you tried on your spiritual journey, where are you now on your spiritual journey, where do you want to be on your spiritual journey?" Share your story in the power of the Holy Spirit and leave the results to God. No matter how someone responds, continue to pray for them. You never know how the Lord will move in someone's life down the road. Sharing your story is not about accomplishing a task; it is about loving the person you are talking tosomeone God loves (Ephesians 2:4-5) and wants to be in a relationship with. Who has God brought to your mind for you to share your story with this week? Pray for an opportunity to share with someone this week, take that step of faith. **Pastor Jeff Hamrick**




FATHER'S LOVE LETTER An intimate message from God to you

Coming July 2023 - Troutman Emerging Community Parishes


The North Carolina and Western North Carolina Conferences of The United Methodist Church (UMC) are thrilled to announce that they have each received a generous grant from The Duke Endowment to support the creation of new United Methodist faith communities and the strengthening of existing congregations within the UMC conferences. Over five years, these grants for \$5.25 million for each Conference will provide vital resources to help the conferences address the challenges posed by recent disaffiliations and continue to spread the message of Jesus' love and hope throughout the state of North Carolina.

The Duke Endowment grants will fund a range of initiatives, including resources for training and equipping pastors and lay leaders, developing innovative ministry programs, and embracing forward thinking as the conferences refocus and regear for this season of ministry. The grant will also provide the conferences a strategic opportunity to better understand the needs and opportunities for new faith communities and congregational revitalization in this post-disaffiliation environment.

Beginning July 1st, Troutman First and Wesley Chapel UMC will be partnered together in the Appalachian District as an Emerging Community with the recent growth coming into our areas and the large number of UMC churches disaffiliating in the Mooresville area that borders Troutman. There will be three Pastors assigned to the Troutman Emerging Community Parish—Rev. Jeff Hamrick, Rev. Todd McCullough will be Community Pastors, and Rev. Tommy Ingalls will be serving alongside as a part-time associate with hopes of becoming full-time within the year. Part of the Duke Endowment grant will cover portions of the three assigned pastors salaries and to help fund innovative outreach ideas to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The North Carolina and Western North Carolina Conferences are committed to creating and strengthening welcoming and vibrant churches where people of all backgrounds can encounter the love of God and grow as disciples of Jesus. With the support of The Duke Endowment, the conferences will be better equipped to fulfill this mission and make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. The three pastors assigned to the Emerging Troutman Parish are excited about the opportunities to working together to further the kingdom of God in our town and beyond.

Troutman First, will you pray, pray, pray, for vision, direction, for outreach. Pray that the message of God's love will spread to all within our community. That all will be welcomed. Pray how God can use you in spreading the good news of God's love for everyone. Remember, we are never too old to be used by God. 
Love Offerings during month of June


News from Troutman First United Methodist Youth Group
