Do you remember the first bicycle that your parents bought for you without training wheels? We were comfortable riding a tricycle with the support of the training wheels. But, a bicycle, we had never ridden one without the support. Patiently, your mom or dad tried to teach us the art of cycling. It did not take us long to figure out one thing that we must do If we were to stay on the bicycle: we must keep moving forward. If you ceased moving forward, we would fall and hurt ourselves.

So it is with the Christian walk with Jesus. We can never live this life on the highest level with Jesus unless we are continually growing and moving forward. We should be closer to God today in heart, soul, body, and mind, than at any other time so far in our lives.

We must not be backward looking people. Paul says in Philippians 3:13—"Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead." (NIV) Paul had every reason to forget what was behind him. He had hunted down followers, he had disrupted churches, and killed followers of Christ. He had followers thrown in jail, and supported and watched the stoning of Stephen, the first Christian martyr. We need not dwell on our past, instead we can concentrate on who we are now because of Christ's sacrifice for us. We are forgiven and have been chosen by God, filled with His Spirit and can move into a life of faith and obedience. God does not want us to be backward looking, going through life looking in the rear view mirror. But we so often can't help ourselves. We remember the hurts of the past and the mistakes we made. It's time now to look ahead and focus on what is before us.
